He has presented at ASPHER Dean's Retreats since 2014. He was elected as an executive member of the ASPHER Board in May 2016. He was awarded

Personal statement

During my involvement with ASPHER I have supported directly the development of ASPHER's agendas for professionalisation, development of capacity and competency and for improving our effectiveness as advocates for the health of the public. I have been active with the European Observatory producing materials for publication this year on organisation and finance of public health and workforce development in Europe (see link).

Public health problems do not obey national boundaries. Infectious diseases, pollution, environmental degradation effect us all.
