Report of the ASPHER Honours Platform for the Annual General Assembly, Deans and Directors Retreat, Porto, June 5th 2024.

Introduction

The ASPHER Honours committee was set up in 2005, comprising the Association's Past Presidents and Andrija Stampar Medallists.

In 2023-2024 the Honours Committee has been co-chaired by Prof Selma Sogoric, Andrija Stampar Medallist, 2020, and Professor John Middleton, Immediate Past President of ASPHER.

At its meeting of March 16th, 2023, a proposed programme of work was set out:

1. A programme of Honours lectures –online or in person.

2. A calendar of major landmarks in European public health

3. Influencing the Pandemic Preparedness Treaty International Negotiating body –in support of PH capacity and workforce; and shared intelligence on Pandemic Fund bids.

4. ASSETS meeting July 3-5th 2023.

5. Support online resources for the New Public Health textbook, edition 4.

1. A programme of Honours lectures –online or in person

A substantial number of Honours Platform members signalled their willingness to present a lecture, to be filmed, in person or online, for the ASPHER website or YouTube channel. It was recognised that this could only start in the later part of the year, and within the available Secretariat resources. Mike Ryan (Stampar Medallist, 2021) delivered an inspirational and engaging address to the Deans' Retreat in Dublin, September 1st, 2023. There is considerable potential for us to build on these lectures by our eminent members.

Laurent Chambaud, Stampar Medallist 2022 has taken on the role of ASPHER champion for Climate change and health education and has undertaken a number of lectures on ASPHER's behalf in this capacity. He and ASPHER young professional Tara Chen have also delivered the astonishingly successful series of climate change education for public health responders course this year, with Global Consortium for Climate Change and Health Education (GCCCHE)

The Honours Platform has been working with young professionals Victoria Stanford, and Jaoa Martins to compile a spreadsheet which can help us plan our diaries of celebrations. The Honours Platform has not delivered collectively in relation to the Pandemic Treaty, but individual members have been active. On specific issues:

Honours platform members (Jose Martin-Moreno, Kasia Czabanovska, and John Middleton) have been influential in the development of major WHO resources launched at the World Health Assembly May 2024, taking forward the public health and emergencies workforce capacity road map. 

4. The Andrija Stampar Summer Educational & Tutoring School (ASSETS)

A successful event was held July 3rd-6th 2023, providing a small group of young public health professionals with an in-depth, intensive mentoring experience presenting their own work and contributing to group mentoring and peer review. https://www.aspher.org/events,220.html Academic Faculty was Honours Platform members Jose-Maria Martin-Moreno, Selma Sogoric and John Middleton. The group also received presentations from European public health organisations, based in Brussels and Gastein. ASSETS for this year has been re-evaluated with potential young professional applicants, and will be presented in October 2024.

Abstract: A tool to recognise major anniversaries in the history of public health

Possible conference themes for this:

• Social participation for health and the role of schools of public health.

Or

• Open topic on schools of public health, their interests and challenges.

Public health students, starting out in their careers, or presidents of public health bodies, have in their heads, key dates in the history of public health: the English Public Health Act perhaps? the birthday of the Italian National Health service? Virchow in Silesia? Or major discoveries: Snow on Cholera? Goldberger on pellagra? Bateson on insulin? Or events in our governance: the establishment of WHO? The International Convention on Human Rights? The Framework convention on climate change?

But do you have the awareness to know when the big anniversaries are coming up? For ASPHER in recent years, we have just managed to mark the bicentenary of Rudolf Virchow, the bicentenary of Louis Pasteur, and the 75th anniversary of the birth of WHO. We missed the bicentenary of Edward Jenner.

Possibly you want to mark an upcoming anniversary with a blog for your school of public health? or for ASPHER? Or for a formal publication? Perhaps it is such a big and significant anniversary you want to put on a celebration conference? This may require you to reflect on the legacy of a discovery; you may wish to send out trailers for your meeting well in advance, and build a list of key speakers who may only be available a year or so ahead?

To assist you in your planning, we have developed a simple spreadsheet tool to alert you to big anniversaries coming up. We will present the tool, not as a finished article, but a work in progress. This your opportunity to enable us to recognise and lay down markers for the major anniversaries in our public health histories within countries, within Europe and globally. And it enables us to celebrate and honour the heroes of public health in whose footsteps we follow.
