Henrique Barros was born in Porto, in 1957, and graduated in Medicine in 1981. During 1988-89 was researcher fellow at the Internal Medicine Department of Lund's University Hospital. In 1991 became Gastroenterology specialist and defended his PhD, with a research on the epidemiology of viral hepatitis. He is Full Professor of Epidemiology at the University of Porto since 2000. He launched the Master Programs in Public Health, Epidemiology and Sociology and Health as well as the doctoral program in Public Health at the University of Porto and the doctoral program in Global Public Health (program director), a joint program with University NOVA of Lisbon, financed by the Portuguese Research Foundation (FCT). He was a member of the Scientific Council for Health Sciences Foundation for Science and Technology (2004-12), National Coordinator of the HIV/AIDS Program (2005-11) and member of the Medical Sciences (MED) Scientific Committee of Science Europe (2012-15). He is currently, Director of the Department Public Health and Forensic Sciences, and Medical Education at the University of Porto Medical School, President of the Institute of Public Health, University of Porto, President of the International Epidemiological Association and President of the National Health Council. He is also Member of the Executive Commission of the National Ethical Committee for Clinical Investigation (CEIC) and Member of

the Executive Board of ASPHER. He has developed research in national and international projects, in areas such as clinical and perinatal epidemiology, cardiovascular, infectious and cancer diseases, which resulted in (co)authorship of more than 400 scientific publications in international journals.
